Lates We continue to have an inordinate number of students arriving past the morning bell on a daily basis. Many days it is as many as 20-30 children late. This creates a very stressful situation for all. Research says that academic achievement is negatively affected by chronic lateness and we want to ensure all our students reach their fullest potential. Office staff spend time signing students in when they need to focus on safe arrival protocols. The students who enter the classroom 10-20 minutes late lose instructional time and a chance to settle into the morning routines. Although we understand that life happens, we respectfully ask that students arrive on time to limit the disruptions to learning and teaching that have already begun. Instruction begins promptly at 9:00am. Students can enter their classrooms starting at 8:40 am to prepare for their day of learning.

School Advisory Council (SAC): Our SAC (School Advisory Council) meets 6 times a year. The members are made up of parents, community members and staff members. Information is shared around policies, protocols, and academic learning taking place at our school. We are still in need of two community members who are neither a parent nor grandparent.

Remembrance Day Ceremony: This year our Remembrance Day ceremony at PEES will be held on Thursday November 7 at 2 pm in the afternoon. Our classes have been working hard on wreaths of remembrance.



Poppy Donations for Remembrance Day - All Portland Estates Elementary School students will be provided with a poppy on November 7. The poppies have been provided by The Canadian Legion. If you would like to make a donation for your child's poppy, you can donate online to The Royal Canadian Legion Dominion Command Poppy Trust Fund. https://legion.ca/home or send in a cash donation to be put in the poppy bin in the office.

Milk order - Parents can order whole white milk for their children for 40 cents each through Nutrislice.com.

NSLunch- The new provincial lunch program is open for ordering for the weeks of November 12- November 22.

Dropping off Items/Picking Up Students: Just a reminder to have all items (lunches, band instruments, clothing) labeled with child's name and Homeroom teacher's name, if you are dropping off items to the school for your child. When picking up your child- please call the office when you have arrived in the parking lot and we will dismiss your child from class.

Head Lice Reminders We encourage parents to make checking their child's head for the presence of nits and or lice a regular part of their routine. Please notify the school if your child has head lice and provide the recommended treatment before returning to school. Call 8-1-1 at any time to speak with a registered nurse for more information and guidance if head lice are still present after the necessary second treatment. Successful treatment included a second application of product 8 to 10 days after the initial treatment. Inclement weather

Did you know? HRCE takes great care when making the decision to alter the regular operations of schools and school buses in the event of severe or inclement weather.

It is HRCE's goal to communicate any changes to the regular operations of schools and/or buses as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. A 6:00 a.m. announcement could be:

 All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours; or

- All schools are open, but some or all buses are not operating for the day; or
- Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or
- All schools are closed for the day.

If weather deteriorates, or is forecasted to worsen throughout the morning, an 11:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- Bused students will be picked up two hours earlier than their regular dismissal time;
 and
- Walking students will be dismissed at their regularly scheduled lunch hour.

Delayed Opening of Schools On school days when conditions exist that it is not safe to open schools at regularly scheduled time but it is predicted that conditions will improve, a 2 hour delayed opening may be considered. Delayed openings would be considered when a severe weather event has concluded, but snow clearing or other operations require additional time. Delayed opening may also be considered when the building is experiencing and issue (power, water) and additional time is required to prepare the facility for opening. In the event of a delayed opening the following will apply:

- School opening will be delayed 2 hours
- •Portland Estates Elementary would open at 11:00 am
- School bus pick up times will be delayed
- Lunch times will not change
- Afternoon class schedules will not change
- Dismissal time will not change- 3 pm




Remembrance Day & Indigenous Veterans Day

Allergy Alerts / Medication Please keep in mind we have numerous students and staff with severe allergies to food and scents. Please remind your children to refrain from wearing scents when in our school and be diligent about the food items your child brings to school. Nut products cannot be sent to school. If your child requires medication at school, an Administration of Medicine form must be filled out. All medicine is kept secured and distributed from our main office. Medications are required to be in the original container and clearly labelled by the pharmacy for your child.

Dress for the Weather: As classes continue to spend more time outside during the school year, please remind your child/ren to dress for the weather. As we get more wet and cold weather, families are asked to have their children dressed appropriately to go outside. While we do hold inside play times during heavy downpours, we recognize that all children benefit from fresh air and outside time, so we encourage rain boots and good outdoor clothes, such as a rainproof jacket, for those days when we will all head outside in rainy/cold weather. And for our youngest Portland Estates students, mud pants or splash pants are a great idea. A full change of clothes in their backpacks is also helpful for all students, should they need to change.

PTO News- Our PTO is still working at warp speed. They continue to offer several items on the school website: Mabels labels, school clothing and they will be gearing up to raffle off Theme baskets before the Holidays.
