Please describe a summary of work undertaken by the SAC to improve student achievement and school performance.

This year the School Advisory Council at Portland Estates continued to focus on improving student achievement in particular – Literacy at the P-3 level and Fact Fluency at the 4-6 level and student and staff well-being. We continued to promote academic achievement in these areas by purchasing resources for the students and staff to support their teaching and learning. We continued to purchase Heggerty materials for classrooms and resource programming, Secret Stories phonological awareness programs for Grades Primary and One and University of Florida literacy materials for lower elementary. Resource and game materials were purchased to support the Fact Fluency in Math as well as extra copies of Fluency, Thinking Classroom and

Open Ended Questions for each Grade level. We continued to add more books into classroom libraries.

Being our first full year after the Covid pandemic, we started to move back to normal routines and student well-being was at the forefront. Classroom Circles and class meetings using the Caring School programs and Cross Age buddies resumed in full. The Schools Plus community outreach worker worked with several groups of students at lunch and we purchased games and materials, restrung tennis racquets to support their activities to improve connectedness and wellness.

The SAC continued to review all monthly P-3 literacy data at our monthly meetings as well as Grade Six assessment results and detailed well-being survey results. The SAC continued to monitor the School Success plan on a monthly basis and was keep abreast of all activities taking place within the classrooms — Literacy and Math coaches, student teachers, UIT schedules. As well, the SAC was made aware of all Professional development taking place in both Literacy and Fact Fluency.

As well, the SAC reviews and approves fundraising initiatives and school supply lists.

This year the SAC focused on the changing school environment – moving from Covid to present and starting to bring back more in person events at the school.
