**Volunteers Needed-** We are inviting parents/guardians/grandparents to come in and read with some of our students on a weekly basis. All volunteers must have a valid criminal records check including vulnerable sectors check and child abuse check on file at the school. These expire every **three years**, and they must be completed within **three months** of the time you submit them to the school office.

#### **Valuables and Electronics**

# HEAD LICE: PLEASE CHECK YOUR CHILD'S HAIR REGULARLY

Reminder to parents to check your child's head regularly for head lice. Please report any discoveries of head lice to the main office (433-7100). A pamphlet has been posted on the school's website as a resource for parents. We invite you to have a look.

The HRSB Head Lice Policy asks parents to:

- $\hfill \square$  Notify the school if their child has head lice;
- ☐ Check other family members or others spending time in the house of children identified as having head lice;
- □ Provide recommended head lice treatment to a child identified as having head lice as outlined by Public *Health How to Prevent, Find and Treat Head Lice,* and complete first treatment prior to their child returning to school;
- $\Box$  Call 8-1-1 at any time to speak with a Registered Nurse for more information and guidance if head lice are still present after the second treatment

#### **Parking**

Visitors to the school are reminded not to park cars in the No Parking area in the front of the school. This is a Fire Lane and a Bus Lane and as such no parking is allowed.



#### **Dismissal Times**

This is a reminder to parents and guardians that there is no supervision on the playground after dismissal. Students are asked to go directly home, to Excel or to their caregivers. If caregivers allow students to play afterschool on the school grounds, we ask that they be supervised at all times.

#### **Visitors to the School**

Visitors to the school are reminded to stop at the office to sign our visitor/guest book and obtain a pass before proceeding throughout the school. Please remember that you may be a parent to your own child, but in many instances a stranger to others. Thank you, your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

# A Way for Families to Report Student Absences

One of our greatest priorities is ensuring all students arrive to school safely each day.

Parents/guardians of students who attend our school now have the option to report their child's absence in advance using a toll-free number, the PowerSchool Parent Portal or an app!

SchoolMessenger SafeArrival – an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for families to inform their child's school if they will be away – powers all three of these options.

If your child will be absent, please let us know by using one of the following methods:

#### **Toll-Free Number**

Call 1-833-582-6940 to report an absence using an automated system.

#### **PowerSchool Parent Portal**

#### SchoolMessenger App

Download the SchoolMessenger app for Android and iOS devices and sign up using your PowerSchool username (full email address).



#### Do you know how to raise a concern?

Did you know that there's a protocol in place to help families contact schools or the HRCE office when you have concerns about your student's education or well-being?

- ➤ All concerns should first be shared with your child's teacher.
- ➤ If your concern is not resolved, you should then contact the principal.
- ➤ If your concern remains unresolved, you can reach out to <u>HRCE's Parent Navigators</u> who can provide information about a wide range of supports and resources or connect you with the school supervisor.
- ➤ If your matter continues to be unresolved, you can then initiate a formal review process in which the matter will be investigated by the appropriate HRCE Directors.
- ➤ The final step is for your concern to be passed on to the Regional Executive Director.

#### **Meet your Parent Navigators**

We know that navigating school system can be overwhelming. The role of the Parent Navigator is to help parents and guardians of HRCE students find and access the right information, resources, tools and services.

"I would say that I help parents 'navigate' the school systems, let them know what resources might be available within HRCE that they may not know about, and actively listen to families who call that may have a situation that needs diffusing, support or problem solving," says Parent Navigator Natasha Horne.

"I would love for families to know we are here for them, and sometimes that's just to listen and not solve anything. We are a non-judgemental ear for them. Sometimes just talking through something with someone that's not involved with your situation is helpful to get some perspective."

Parent Navigator Amelia Downey says the most common questions she receives include: How do I make a school transfer request? What age can my child attend school with HRCE? How do I speak with a school supervisor? Do I have to visit a school to register my child? How can I obtain my child's school records/diploma/transcripts?

"What I love the most about my role the most is the moment when I know I have made a difference in a person's day through the support I have provided to them during our call," Amelia says.


